Born in Russia, KSENIIA PROSHINA began her vocal studies in Raisa Gladkova's class at the Samara Academy of Arts and graduated in 2016. She performed the title role in Rimsky-Korsakov's **The Snow Maiden** and **Sonya Gurvich** in *The Dawns Here Are Quiet* by Kirill Molchanov.

Since 2014, the soprano has been focusing on the Italian repertoire with Alessandro Svab at the Accademia Lirica Santa Croce in Trieste, Italy. She played **Gilda** in *Rigoletto*, **Susanna** in *Le nozze di Figaro* and **Adina** in *L'Elisir d'amore*.

In 2018, she was a finalist in the Toti Dal Monte international song competition and won several prizes in famous competition as Tenor Viñas in Barcelona and others. More recently she won the Grand Prix at the Gianluca Campochiaro in Italy.

Kseniia Proshina joined the **Paris Opera Academy** in September 2019.

At the beginning of the season 2019/2020, she participated in the China tour of the Paris Opera Academy and performed at the Grand Theatre in Shanghai, the Poly Theatre in Shenyang and the Jiangsu Art Theatre in Nanjing .

In May 2021, she performed **Lucia** in Britten's *The Rape of Lucretia* at the Théâtre des Bouffes du Nord conducted by Léo Warynski and directed by Jeanne Candel.

At the beginning of 2022, she performed the role of **Barbarina** in *Le nozze di Figaro* conducted by Gustavo Dudamel and directed by Netia Jones at the Palais Garnier.

In the spring of 2022, on the stage of the Athénée Théâtre Louis-Jouvet, the Grand Théâtre de Dijon and the Maison de la Culture d'Amien she performed **Amore** and **Valetto** in Monteverdi's *L'Incoronazione di Poppea* conducted by Vincent Dumestre and directed by Alain Françon.

In May and June 2022, she performed the role of the **1st Zauber mädchen** of the second group in Wagner's *Parsifal* conducted by Simone Young and directed by Richard Jones.

Kseniia Proshina is the winner of the AROP Opera Award of the season 2020/2021.
